The classroom represents purpose, impact, and leadership.



# TSA Pre-Check

- Overall minimum GPA 2.75; Content GPA 2.5
- All pre-requisite coursework completed
- Education courses completed with C- or higher
- Incomplete grades must be resolved prior to placement


# Planning Your Journey


## Unified Early Childhood

- One Early Childhood Center Destination





# Jayhawk Destinations – Travel Buddies

Traveling with a group provides shared experiences, support, and built-in problem solving since traveling to the same destination.

Occasionally trips (placements) are chosen not for comfort, but for growth and reflection.

These destinations are committed to addressing academic, language, and socio-economic challenges. These are purpose driven placements that build cultural competence.

Whether you choose to travel solo or with a group, both paths lead to the same destination—a variety of experiences. The Jayhawk Destinations offer the journey with companions and are available for one or two semesters but not necessarily the same destination.

# Restricted Zones

- Destinations that family are currently visiting (working or attending)
- Destinations that you have previously visited (personally attended)
- Reaching out to a destination to arrange your stay (placement)

Travel to the same city is permissible but a different hotel is required  
(Same district but not the same school)

# Booking Windows

- Flights must be booked during designated windows and a request submitted for each requested destination (placement)

Program	Booking Request(s)
Elementary, EEU, UEC	2 Requests (Fall, Spring)
Secondary	2 Requests (Fall, Spring or Fall, Fall)
STEM Teach	1 Request (Fall or Spring)
Physical Education, Art, Music	1 Request (Fall or Spring)

- Fall flight requests – Send to travel agent by submitting in ELC by February 15
- Spring flight requests – Send to travel agent by submitting in ELC by August 15
- Airlines (districts) respond as they work through their booking process; Flight confirmation and seat assignments are sent once available through the ELC platform



# Booking Requests

- Experiential Learning Cloud (ELC) serves as your digital flight hub, keeping everyone connected, informed, and on course.
- Log-in instructions will be sent to your KU email
- Once logged in, complete the following:
  - Pre-Tasks
    - Booking Request (Request/Preference Form) – Selecting your destination choices
    - Agreement Form – Agreeing to flight terms and conditions (program dispositions)

# Security Screening

## Validity Background Check

- All travelers must clear security before boarding
- Background check required to ensure a safe learning environment
- Complete screening via Validity (\$37 fee)
  - [Click here](#) for instructions
- Upload results to ELC for clearance

# Security Screening Health Clearance

- Every traveler must be cleared for safe flight
- HEALTH ASSESSMENT
  - Health assessment confirms you are fit to work safely with students
  - Provider verifies no condition that would impact student health or safety
- TUBERCULOSIS TEST
  - Once test is administered, you will return in 48 hours for the results

# Hazard Awareness Screening

## Bloodborne Pathogen

- All travelers must be trained to respond to in-flight hazards
- Bloodborne pathogen training prepares you to respond safely to potential exposure

- Upload certificate of completion to ELC

# Security Screening Risk Coverage Clearance

- Every flight requires proper insurance before takeoff
- Professional liability coverage protects you in the event of an in-flight (classroom) incident
- One-million-dollar coverage is required for boarding
- If utilizing National Educators Association – KNEA (\$18 fee)
  - [Click here](#) to sign up after APRIL 1, 2026 for the 2026-2027 academic year
  - Choose Aspiring Educator
- Upload proof to ELC

# Security Screening

## Academic Clearance

- No flight departs without final clearance from tower approval
- Academic Approval Form – [click here](#) to review with your advisor
  - Verifies eligibility for takeoff
  - Confirms coursework, GPA, and program requirements are met
- Required for final boarding authorization – upload to ELC

# Flight Confirmation & Seat Assignment

- Airlines (districts) respond as they work through their booking process; Flight confirmation and seat assignments are sent once available through the ELC platform
- Expect Confirmation in ELC
  - Fall Requests - May 15
  - Spring Requests - December 15

# Flight Safety & Expectations

- Professional image sets the tone for the journey
- Flight Crew Appearance - Attire
  - Dress professional
- Online Appearance – Social Media Accounts
  - Build trust and credibility
- Additional Flight Safety and Expectations reviewed in late April
  - Date forthcoming

# Ready for Takeoff

- Takeoff for destinations:
  - Student Teaching - district start date for teachers in August/January
  - Advanced Teaching Practicum - after Labor Day

# Flight Crew

- Clinical Supervisor (mentor teacher)
- University Supervisor (KU representative)
- Both provide ongoing feedback, evaluation, and guidance
